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the preparation of school based agriculture teachers has been a part of public education for over 100 years however there is a lack of texts available that address the components of teacher education in agriculture including teacher preparation and related activities further study that goes beyond concepts to include practice and

this collection of essays edited by the distinguished historian of education richard aldrich examines past present and future relationships between the private and public dimensions of knowledge and education following the introduction it is divided into three sections key themes and turning points in britain in the eighteenth nineteenth and twentieth centuries examples from the twentieth century of non formal education with particular reference to girls and women the care and education of pre school children sex education and family history an analysis of the private and public dimensions associated with globalization and international education and of examples drawn from australia and the usa this book will become required reading not only in respect of contemporary and historical debates about private and public spheres in education but also with reference to the wider themes of the creation diffusion and ownership of knowledge

the children of asian migrants are often perceived to be perfect students ambitious studious and compliant they are remarkably successful routinely outperforming other students in exams dominating selective school intakes and disproportionately winning places at prestigious universities while their hard work and success have been praised their achievements have ignited fierce debates about whether their migrant parents are pushing too hard or whether they ought to be lauded for their commitment to education critics see a dark side symbolised by the tiger mother who is obsessed with producing overachieving dragon children what is often missing in these debates is an understanding of what drives asian migrant parents approaches to education this book explores how aspirations for their children s future reinforce their anxieties about being newcomers in an unequal society

this book traces the decline of the public comprehensive high school new educational markets emphasized school diversity and parental choice rather than social equity through common schooling and they were criticized for declining standards the book also considers government education policies and their regional manifestations

it is unusual to read a story that is so confrontingly real and yet so profoundly uplifting

prime minister kevin rudd heath ducker grew up on the wrong side of the tracks he couldn't even see the tracks from where he lived in dilapidated government housing with shattered windows and holes in the floor that let the weeds climb through he lived with his emotionally fragile single mother and nine siblings conceived with half a dozen different fathers none of whom ever moved in most days there was nothing to eat but breakfast cereal just when it seemed things couldn't get any worse soon after heath s twelfth birthday he was sexually abused by the father of his only real friend however heath was determined from the outset that he would not let his circumstances beat him as a teenager he was so committed to passing his final exams that he lugged his books up a mulberry tree and onto the roof of his house to study in the only quiet spot he could find as a result of extraordinary courage and resilience heath ducker is a lawyer with a passionate commitment to improving the lot of underprivileged kids he lobbies politicians on their behalf gives his weekends over to voluntary work at camps for teenagers in trouble and he leads treks for young people along the notorious kokoda track in the highlands of new guinea in 2008 the then prime minister of australia the hon kevin rudd mp presented him with adc s leadership award 2008 presented to only 26 people from across australia when heath appeared on abc television s australian story in 2006 he provided inspiration for thousands of viewers his life story has continued to inspire as one of the most frequently viewed episodes on the abc tv website now in a room at the top heath ducker for the first time tells his story in his own words

asian migration and mobilities are transforming education cultures in the anglosphere prompting mounting debates about tiger mothers and dragon children and competition and segregation in anglosphere schools this book challenges the cultural essentialism which prevails in much academic and popular discussion of asian success and in relation to asian education mobilities as anxiety and aspiration within these spaces are increasingly ethnicised the children of asian migrants are both admired and resented for their educational success this book explores popular perceptions of asian migrant families through in depth empirically informed accounts on the broader economic social historical and geo political contexts within which education cultures are produced this includes contributions from academics on global markets and national policies around migration and education classed trajectories and articulations local formations of ethnic capital and transnational assemblages that produce education and mobility as means for social advancement at a time when our schooling systems and communities are undergoing rapid transformations as a result of increasing global mobility this book is a unique and important contribution to an issue of pressing significance this book was originally published as a special issue of the journal of ethnic and migration studies
